

The Town Council of Timnath unanimously approved the renaming of several streets in Timnath on April 16, 2008 to reflect the rich history of Timnath and the surrounding area. The table below outlines the changes and the historical significance of each of the names

Existing Street Name	New Street Name	History Behind the New Name*
Larimer County Road 1 / County Line Road	Latham Parkway	Name of a stage stop located at the confluence of the Platte and Poudre rivers before the Union Colony was established
Larimer County Road 3	Three Bell Parkway	Historical Name of Road was Three Bell Lane.
Larimer County Road 5 – Existing Alignment	Main Street	Historical Name will continue to be used.
Larimer County Road 5 – New Alignment	Timnath Parkway	New roadway named for Town itself.
I-25 Frontage Road – East/West Section	Swetsville Zoo Road	Swetsville Zoo was started in 1985 by the Swets Family and is a local tourist attraction showcasing a variety of metal sculptures.
I-25 Frontage Road – North/South Section	Weitzel Street	Prominent Family in the area, Esther Weitzel was the Timnath Postmaster for 45 years
Larimer County Road 40	Buss Grove Road	Chosen for several reasons including: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Buss family was one of the original homesteaders to the area. 2. Buss Grove was one of the few areas along the river with trees and therefore was the site of several early town functions. 3. First School in Timnath was the Buss School.
Larimer County Road 38	Harmony Road	Existing Road Name
Larimer County Road 36	River Pass Road	Historically, this road passed over the river bridge (that is no longer there) to the Riverside School.
