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Timnath Food Truck Vendor Permit Checklist:

Please attach the following documentation to your application package:

- Site plan if location is on private property showing the location of all structures, access equipment, and parking.
- Authorization to Use Property Form.
- If on public property, provide insurance certificate - Timnath named as additional insured and certificate holder.
- Colorado Secretary of State Document of Good Standing
- Copies of Town, County, and State sales tax licenses
- Copy of Larimer County Health Permit
- PFA proof of inspection

Timnath Food Truck Vendor Requirements:

(Please initial that you have read and agree to adhere to the Timnath Land Use Code Requirement for Food Trucks:

	Requires a food truck vendor permit application.
	May vend only on lots in non-neighborhood zone districts or on streets in locations in non-residential zone districts where parallel parking is allowed.
	Vending may occur in a residentially zoned lot if it is a part of a Special Events permit or if the vendor is exclusively selling novelty items such as ice cream, snow cones, or frozen treats, or if there is a site with an active building permit.
	May not vend within 200 feet from the property line of a public or private school for students from pre-school through 12th grade.
	May vend only food and non-alcoholic beverages.
	Logos or signage must be permanently attached to the mobile food truck with no banners or signs put up on adjacent trees buildings, or light poles.
	Hours of operation when on a lot or street that abuts an existing residentially zoned lot shall be limited from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.
	The food truck shall utilize power from an adjacent building as best as possible, if power is not available a generator can be used—given it does not exceed 80 decibels.
