What we did

• We reviewed all of the data collected by the Town of Timnath and Colorado State University.



- Our program evaluated the air data and considered the potential acute and chronic health risks to nearby residents and schoolchildren.
- We also compared odor thresholds to levels of contaminants found in the air to help answer questions from community members about the relationship between odors and health impacts.

What we found

- Contaminants in the air at Timnath are not expected to harm the health of residents or children attending school at Timnath Elementary School.
- Odors in the air in Timnath are not expected to harm the health of residents or schoolchildren.
- No further air monitoring is necessary at this time.
